Rules and Regulations,

1st. The Fair will open on Tuesday, Sept. 7th, 1897, and continue four days. The gates will be epened from 8 o'clock a. m., until 6 p. m. All officers and employees are requested to be at their posts during these hours.

2nd. Every animal and article for exhibition must be entered before 9 o'clock Tuesday evening of the Fair, and be on the Fair grounds Wednesday morning in time for the stock to join the procession.

3rd. Every premium, animal and article placed on exhibition will be retained until Friday, 4 o'clock p. m., or forfeit their premiums, unless permission is granted to persons from a distance. All animals will be permitted to be taken off the grounds at four o'clock p. m., each day, but must be returned by 9 o'clock a. m., next morning.

4th. No person, except the awarding committee on duty and officers of the Association, will be allowed inside of the arena while the exhibition is going on.

5th. An entrance fee of 10 per cent. of the amount contested for will be charged persons, except in the Ladies' Department, which will be free to all, except for special premiums. Two entries will be required on special premiums, that is, if but one person makes an entry, one other entry fee will be charged that person.

6th. The Secretary's books will be open in his office to receive entries from the 1st of August until 9 o'clock Tuesday evening of the Fair. Entries can be made by letter or agent. (Please make your entries as early as possible.). The Secretary's books cannot be examined by any but the proper officers of the Fair.

7th. Tickets 25 cents per day. Children between 10 and 15 years old, 15 cents. Gate checks and return tickets. Persons can pass out at any time.

8th. No premiums will be paid on articles or animals-not named in this premium list.

9th. No premium will be paid to persons who did not attend the Fair.

10th. No animal will be allowed more than one premium in the exhibition ring except for sweepstakes or special premiums.

11th. All persons entering stock for exhibition will be required to have them inside the arena within five minutes after called for or be ruled out.

12th. No person will be allowed to exhibit Bulls without having them under the control of a groom.

13th. The Secretary will not receive entries on articles for exhibition Hall after 12 o'clock the second day.

14th. The Association will use all reasonable means to prevent accidents but will not be responsible for any that may occur.

Members of the press, officers of Fairs, and ministers of the gospel, are cordially invited.


